#### PRESIDENT'S LETTER

#### **Dear Friends**

The cicadas are singing outside the Foundation's premises in Neutral Bay, an unmistakable sign of Sydney summertime. I do hope that you all enjoyed a wonderful Christmas holiday, a memorable festive season and a Happy New Year. The Festival of Sydney, with its imaginative smorgasbord of local and international events has drawn to a close, and Carol Martin has a long list of theatrical treats for you to enjoy in 2018.

Please read the list carefully and book early as the limited number of good seats we acquire for the Foundation Friends are usually very popular.

FOUNDATION GRANTS: Last November Foundation received 47 applications for financial assistance. All were delivered to our Grants Committee to study, consider and make recommendations to the Board. The Grants panel who presently undertake this important task, consists of Foundation Directors Elizbeth Butcher AM, John Clark AM and Kevin Jackson and former Foundation Chairman Gary Simpson AM. As you will recall Dr Seaborn supported projects and individuals from across the wide spectrum of the performing arts. The decision-making is an exacting process. Not all applicants can be selected and not all requested amounts can be approved. However thirteen, applicants recommended and all were approved by our Board.

Congratulations to the following applicants. Theatre of Image (\$10,000); Monkey Baa Theatre Company (\$5000); Red Stitch Actors' Theatre (\$10,000); Alex Galeazzi - individual performing artist (\$10,000); Zac Pidd - individual performing artist (\$10,000); Kay Yasugi – individual performing artist (\$5000); Shopfront Arts Company (\$10,000); Kate Gaul – individual performing artist (\$10,000); Power House Youth Theatre (\$10,000); Matriark Theatre (\$10,000); Sydney Theatre Awards (\$10,000); Sport For Jove Theatre Company (\$10,000); The Seymour Centre (\$10,000).

We hope that the grants we are able to provide at this semi-annual (twice yearly) grant round will assist all successful recipients in developing exciting contributions to the performing arts scene.

It is most gratifying to receive acknowledgements and heartfelt thanks from Foundation grantees and I would like to share a few examples with you. We have received a post card written on behalf of the Monkey Baa Theatre Company presently touring in Philadelphia, USA and addressed to 'Peter and the SB&W team': "Mothball and Diary of a Wombat Company took Philadelphia by storm!

The audience of children & delegates adored the show. Thank you from the bottom of our hearts for all your support. Eva." And from Ian Phipps producer of the Sydney Theatre Awards. 'On behalf of the critics panel of the Sydney Theatre Awards: and in fact from the entire Sydney theatre community, may I say thank you again to the Foundation for their generosity and ongoing support. Without the grant from the Foundation, we would not be able to hold an awards ceremony nor have beautiful framed certificates to present to the award winners.' And from Kay Yasugi, puppeteer and General Secretary of UNIMA Australia, the Puppetry organisation of Australia: 'Thank you very much for my individual grant. I was so glad I was able to receive it in person and have a wonderful tour of your amazing puppetry collection! I do hope I can come back soon to see the puppets up close & I will bring some more puppeteers and enthusiasts with me! Thank you again.'

And we thank all our generous Friends, supporters and donors who understand the importance of assisting a wide range of projects and performing artists. You enable us to enable them.

#### PERFORMING ARTS COLLECTION:

We presently have ten volunteers who regularly help at the Foundation. The majority help our archivist Neil Pollock in his wonderful work, sorting, rationalizing and cataloguing our Collection. Removing duplication allows room for controlled growth and ensures we have a 'living' collection.

A growing number of people from the performing arts and local Council are visiting the Collection. We are excited to be listed in the North Sydney Council's 2018 Arts & Culture Guide as the Seaborn, Broughton & Walford Foundation Performing Arts and Study **Centre.** And, indeed, we are successfully assuming this role. The Australian Theatre For Young People recently held a successful workshop with a young playwright in our intimate rehearsal space, and Ian Phipps (Sydney Theatre Awards) also shared his impressions: 'The new SB&W premises are easy to find, laid out well and spacious. For theatre enthusiasts it's easy to find items of interest in the collection, and the meeting rooms are suitable for small scale rehearsals and presentations. They also have the advantage of being metres from a thriving shopping strip, regular buses and street parking.' Another visitor from the performing arts, Leona Geeves, wrote: 'Researching Leona Deane, Trafford Whitelock, Carrie Moore. Thanks to Neil and Carolyn- found the program for 'The Dybbuk' and my late mother was ASM, AMAZING to have the program.'

**RECENT EVENTS:** On behalf of the Foundation, Carolyn and I attended the Lord Mayor's Christmas Reception at the Town Hall and the Actors' Benevolent Fund Christmas Party. With other Foundation Directors, we attended the Sandra Bates Awards and the Christmas gathering at the Ensemble Theatre, as well as the Sydney Theatre Awards at the Seymour Centre. The Foundation was warmly acknowledged and applauded as a major sponsor. Carolyn also represented us at the Live Performance Australia (LPA) Centenary Awards to honour 10 luminaries of the live entertainment and wider performing arts industry. This year marks the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the restoration of the Independent. This achievement was warmly acknowledged by the North Sydney Mayor Jilly Gibson, and Australia Day Ambassador, opera singer Amelia Farrugia, at the Australia Day Citizenship Ceremony at the Independent Theatre.
